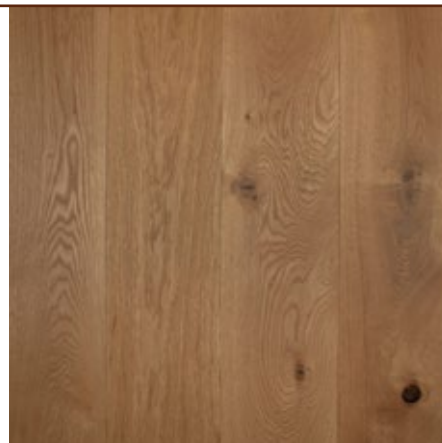

Timber Grading

Floorex timber floors come in 'light feature grade', showing a small knots and variation in the mixed with prime grade (no knots) timber. Planks vary from AB grade (no knots) also incorporating C grade with small filled knots, and sapwood. The colour of the filler is matched to complement the natural structure of the wood, where features such as knots are present but may vary from batch to batch.

UV Lacquer Coating

Floorex timber floors are coated with matt-finish UV cured lacquer for a hardwearing, highly scratch resistant surface. Our UV lacquer gives the benefit of looking and feeling like oil finish without the maintenance required.

Installation Method

- Glue down installation only
- Suitable for underfloor heating (please ask for guidelines prior to installation)

Compliance

- Signature Plank range has been tested and complies with E3/AS1 standards in NZ. Testing documents available on request.

Warranty

- Residential - 25 Years
- Commercial - 5 Years

Floorex operates as a "supply and install" provider and as such all floors installed by Floorex carry a 25-year warranty in residential applications and 5 years in commercial applications. Our installation system complies to current NZ requirements and our floors are installed taking into account unique site conditions by our team of expert installers.

Warranty is limited to product failure and does not cover mistreatment, heavy use, lack of maintenance or unforeseen situations such as flood or adverse environmental conditions.
